veterinary bills, and services like transportation to vet appointments, dog walking and referrals to other services.

- Free and low-cost spay/neuter appointments
- Discounted vaccinations and microchipping for dogs and cats
- Free pet behavior and training tips
- Free dog licensing (proof of rabies vaccination required)
