Elizabeth A. Pecsi honored with prestigious Otto Bos Lifetime Achievement Award

SAN DIEGO — San Diego Humane Society Communications Director Elizabeth A. Pecsi is the 2018 winner of the esteemed Public Relations Society of America Otto Bos Lifetime Achievement Award.



The award recognizes an experienced practitioner for lifetime achievement in public relations. It requires examples of advancing the profession of public relations through best practices, including ethics, research and mentoring. The award is named after the late Otto Bos, who was press secretary and a strategic confidant of former California Governor Pete Wilson.

"It is an honor to be recognized by my colleagues in public relations," said Pecsi. "The award came as a surprise, but it makes me feel good that so many people value my work."

Pecsi assumed the role as director of communications at San Diego Humane Society in August of 2016.
