## **SDHS Emergency Response Team Deploys to Butte County**

Team Departs to Assist with Humane Law Enforcement Duties in Areas Impacted by the Camp Fire

What: San Diego Humane Society's Emergency Response Team will load up to depart for Butte County, California on Thursday, Nov. 15 at 5 p.m. The SDHS Emergency Response Team, made up of six Humane Law Enforcement Officers, will be on the front lines helping animals impacted by the Camp Fire, which has burned more than 140,000 acres in Northern California. The team has FEMA training and is ready to assist with rescues of large and small animals, as well as Humane Law Enforcement related activities.
