
Empty the Shelters Promotion to Make Space for Pets in L.A.

Adoption fees for adult dogs and cats reduced to \$25 thanks to Bissell Pet Foundation

SAN DIEGO — Animal lovers in San Diego have a unique opportunity to bring home a new furry family member while making a difference for pets impacted by the fires in Los Angeles.

From January 15 to 26, 2025, the <u>Bissell Pet Foundation</u> is sponsoring an "Empty the Shelters" promotion, reducing adoption fees for adult dogs and cats (7 months and older) to just \$25 at San Diego Humane Society. This special event aims to find loving homes for as many pets as possible so San Diego Humane Society can provide critical support to shelters in fire-ravaged areas.

Why Adopt Now? This promotion comes at a vital time as shelters across Los Angeles are seeing an influx of injured,



stray and owner-surrendered animals due to the Palisades and Eaton Fires. San Diego Humane Society is reaching out to assist these affected shelters but needs to create space in its own facilities to make this lifesaving effort possible.

When You Adopt from San Diego Humane Society:

- You help create space for other animals in urgent need.
- You bring home a pet who has been carefully assessed and cared for.
- Your pet comes microchipped, spayed/neutered and vaccinated.
- You gain access to adoption benefits, training advice, an adoption guarantee, pet supplies, educational resources and lifelong support.
