## Nine Puppies Abandoned in Sealed Plastic Bag in Escondido


SDHS Asks the Community for Information in Animal Cruelty Case

**SAN DIEGO** — <u>San Diego Humane Society</u> is looking for information to identify the person responsible for abandoning nine puppies in an emptied dog food bag, sealed with duct tape, in Escondido. A good Samaritan discovered the puppies at Kit Carson Park early on Jan. 31, 2019 and immediately brought them to San Diego Humane Society's Escondido Campus.

The puppies appear to be Shar Pei mixes, about 10-14 days old. San Diego Humane Society's Humane Law Enforcement division has begun a felony cruelty investigation to find the person responsible for abandoning the dogs.

"This is a heartbreaking case, because we would have taken those puppies at San Diego Humane Society, no questions asked," said Laurel Monreal, sergeant of humane law enforcement for San Diego Humane Society.

"Anyone who needs help with their animals can bring them to us. We are an open admission shelter."



Crime Stoppers is offering a reward of up to \$1,000 for information that leads to an arrest in this case.
